**INFORMATION FOR PARENTS / GUARDIANS**

1. Parents are required to enrol their child in a suitable centre for the learning of Non-Tamil Indian language as it is not provided in schools. Currently, the Board for the Teaching and Testing of South Asian Languages (BTTSAL), a community body, oversees the delivery of NTIL instruction and assessment across school levels. Please inform the school of your enrolled centre within 1 month from the approval date.
2. Non-Tamil Indian languages will not be offered at the higher mother tongue level at the PSLE and GCE 'O' and 'A' levels.
